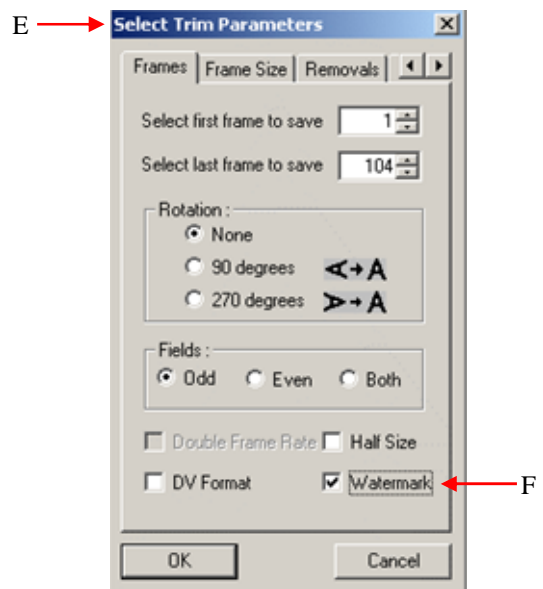
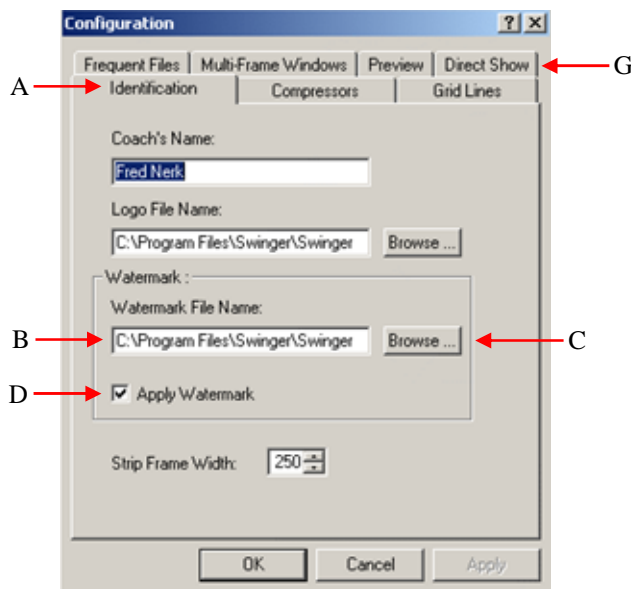


**Introduction**

When creating new video files a Watermark can be added to the top right corner of the video frame. This allows you to personalize new video files you create. A Watermark is an image file which must be in bitmap (.bmp) format. When applied, the Watermark will be scaled so that it will occupy less than a 1/4 of the frame dimension. A watermark cannot be added to files that are saved in DV format.

**Adding a Watermark**

To add or change a Watermark, go to *File, Configuration, Identification* (labeled A in screenshot below). The Watermark file location can be directly entered into the box (B), or the *Browse* button (C) can be used to locate the file. The checkbox is used to turn this feature on and off as a default for all new files. If the *Watermark* checkbox (D) is ticked, then a tick will always appear in the Watermark checkbox in the *Select Trim Parameters* (E) dialog box. However, you can over-ride this default un-ticking the *Watermark* (F) box, and vice versa. A Watermark can only be applied if the source file has been opened in Direct Show mode. To select this mode go to *File, Configuration, Direct Show* (G) and tick *Always use Direct Show to open video files*. Once a file has been saved with a Watermark, this Watermark cannot be removed from the video.
